Report (T. Aerts)	Social Justice (new curriculum) – Julianne Cameron and Rachelle Tyrrell (teachers) - Support for initiatives (whole school or select classes), such as orange shirt day (residential school survivors), guest speakers for multiple classes on anti-violence project, PRIDE group (re: resources available in the community), and Coalition against Homelessness. \$300 for honouraria
	Debate Team – Rachelle Tyrrell and Julianne Cameron (teachers) – Debate Club – For a model UN and five other debate events. Reynolds has been very successful in past competitions. Students contributing to costs. \$1000 for event registration fees.
	Julianne Cameron (teacher) – Reynolds Success Committee – To recognize, celebrate and inspire. Awards (medals, pins, certificates, seals, etc.) for academics, volunteering, athletics. \$4400.

	Band - Dave Flello (Band Director) – Items for recognition (approx. 70 awards/yr). 238 students in the program. Approx. 75 performances per year. Students raise money for their own instruments, etc., as well as for the music program (e.g., for students who can't afford instruments, etc.). \$2500
	Spoken Word Poetry - Brad Cunningham (Teacher/Director) – To go to Hullabaloo competition and to bring poets into the school. Have been six times to Hullabaloo and have won three times. See Reynolds slam poetry YouTube page. Reynolds has become very well known for the spoken word poetry. \$2050
