Capstone Project

Mentor: You need to have an adult other than your parent or educator at Reynolds to talk to a minimum of 3 times while working on your capstone. Beginning, middle and end.

Share your ideas with mentor and hopefully they have some suggestions.

POST SECONDARY

- Post-secondary does not always mean university or college. For some it means volunteering, travelling and/or working.
- Whatever it is, we are here to support you as you start that journey.

GPA or Research Universities

- Competitive GPA based admission
- Example: the big ones, such as UBC, SFU, UVic, U of T, McGill etc.

****Always check your institution for up to date information**

First Applied-First Registered Post-Secondary Schools

- Example: Camosun, Douglas College
- Apply **early** for your best chance at getting what you want.
- If you meet the admission criteria and there is a seat, you apply first, you are in!
- Note: Camosun has two GPA based program offerings- Nursing and Medical Radiography. There are different due dates for these programs. **Check the Camosun website for up to date information.**

NURSING

- Highly competitive at all schools
- Camosun/UVic Application deadline is Dec 15th.
Apply through UVic for this program.
- Work to attain your highest GPA possible, check all your grade 11 and 12 prerequisites.
- Camosun-Uvic admission is currently grades based only. Note: Douglas College (Vancouver) is accepting first qualified, first applied.

When to Apply ?

- Each institution has different dates
- Start applying - usually Oct 1
- Deadlines - each school can be different.
The Nursing deadline is usually earlier than other programs.
- By Nov 1, most schools in Canada and the US are accepting applications.

****Always check your institution for up to date information**

How ?

BC - use the EducationPlanner if applying to more than two schools.

Not all BC schools subscribe but links are listed here.

Alberta - ApplyAlberta

Ontario - OUAC (also separate college app site)

All others - go to the school websites to apply

****Application Centre's will add to the processing time - DO NOT wait until the last minute.**

You will need...

1. PEN # (student services or Mrs. Turnbull can give this to you, it is also on your report card)
2. A copy of your final grade 11 grades and any completed grade 12 grades.
3. Credit or debit card to pay application fees (non-refundable).
4. Record the application confirmation number and the fee confirmation.

Transcripts

Create an account in the
“Student Transcript Service”

The BC Ministry of Education will send
your transcript to the schools you select.

Do this now

****Some schools will still require you to send hard copy transcripts. Read all communication carefully - do not skim! If you miss something it is on you.**

Checklist

1. Pay the application fee
2. Your application **will not** be fully processed until payment is received.
3. Submit your application and **save/print** the page with your application ID #.
4. By letter, but most likely **by email**, you will receive your **permanent** university or college **ID #** that is used to access your status, pay tuition, and choose courses.

Do not lose this number

At some institutions you must create an account to apply.

After you have applied

- Check your email often
- Log into your personal account at the university/college using the student number sent to you from that institution.
- This is where you will find your next steps, self-report your grades(if required), apply for scholarships, submit extra supplemental applications, pay tuition, choose classes and correspond with future profs.

- Replaces Math 10 Provincial Exam
- **MUST** be done in order to graduate
- Similar to FSA 4 and FSA 7
 - 4 point scale
- We do not know how post-secondary will use this assessment
- Will occur in January and June
