Treasurer's Report

April 26, 2023

Operating Account:

(Laurel)

March 31st Bank Statement balance is \$588.65, the only activity being a \$1.95 service charge. There are no outstanding cheques.

Gaming Account:

March 31st Bank Statement: the balance is \$18,861.99 which includes a reimbursement cheque to the school for \$4463.52. There is one outstanding cheque for \$14.43.

April 14 Gaming Cheque was issued to the school for \$6637.34. At this time there are pending expenses of \$4654.45 which brings the total available to \$7555.77.

Recommended Gaming Budget Adjustment

Musical Theatre was over-budget by \$116.37. Drumming was over by \$65.37. Can we vote to approve covering the extra funds? Laurel motions that PAC approve these overages; Willow seconds the motion.

Also, last year the Grade 9 Program purchased scarfs for \$2796.98 with the idea of asking PAC to cover a portion of the amount over a 3 year period. Last year they received \$1094.10, this year they received \$825.00 which leaves a balance of \$877.88. If there are adequate funds left in the gaming account after all other budgeted items have been paid out would the PAC consider covering this amount in June? Maryse motions to approve the last payment on the scarves (\$877.88) if the funds are available by the June meeting; Peter seconds it.
