## **Inclement Weather Guidelines**

As the winter weather creeps in on us, here is a friendly reminder of guidelines on inclement weather days.

#### *In the event of a school closure due to inclement weather:*

- A decision to not open schools will be made by 6:00 a.m.
- The district will contact Thirdwave busing in the event of a school closure
- Appropriate messaging about school closures and busing cancellations will be updated on the District website, social media channels and local media.
- Public communication will occur by 6:30 am.

#### Inclement weather and schools remain open:

- Plan ahead to the best of your ability, follow the forecasts, consider alternate plans
- Dress appropriately
- Each family can decide if it is safe for their student to travel to school
- Students away from school are responsible for making up any missed work
- Travel safely walkways and parking lots may be slippery

## Did you know...? Getting to school on time is important:

An ask from your school team.....

We have been noticing a trend of students arriving late to class especially during the first block of the day. Teachers report some days they have as low as 50% of their students in class and ready to learn by the second bell.

We understand the importance of sleep for teenagers but we also know that missing instructional time is problematic. Factors such as the city bus schedule can be a challenge; however, if we can start with simply encouraging your student to arrive on-time we hope that it will make a difference as it truly takes a team

Beginning in semester two all students that do not have a pre-excused late for any of our four blocks will need to sign in at the office if they are 30 minutes or more late for class. We do understand that students may have various reasons for being late; however, once a student has not attended class for a 30 minute period of time or greater they will be considered absent. Students will then be required to sign in and a notification will be sent home. Students will then be given a pass to present to their classroom teacher.

This is a slight shift in procedure that we will continually monitor to see if there is an impact.



## **Reynolds PAC:**
