Mission Statement: Umbrella demonstrates excellence in the development and delivery of innovative and unique services to support individuals and their loved ones struggling with substance use issues.

Vision= Those affected by substance use and co-occurring mental health challenges have access to a broad range of appropriate and connected community supports.

Umbrella outreach offers support, counsel, guidance, education, and advocacy to individuals as they chart their journey toward reduction and/or abstinence. Umbrella outreach is staffed by individuals who are either in recovery, or have been deeply impacted by addiction.

Online Courses



- If you are planning to take a course online:

 - Need to be almost complete by April 2026
 - Set a goal for 50% done by Christmas
 - DO NOT PROCRASTINATE

 Example: the big ones, such as UBC, SFU, UVic, U of T, McGill etc.

**Always check each institution for up to date information

First Applied-First Registered Post-Secondary Schools

- Examples: Camosun, Douglas College
- Apply early for your best chance at getting what you want.
 - If you meet the admission criteria and there is a seat, you apply first, you are in!
- Note: <u>Camosun has four GPA</u> based program offerings-Nursing, Medical Radiography, Sonography and the Athletic and Exercise Therapy program. There are different due dates for these programs. Check the Camosun website for up to date information (as of 2024)

Before you Apply

- Know prerequisites for your program
- Know application deadlines
- For information check:
 - University and College websites, watch the Reynolds APP, Career Centre & The CC Website

When to Apply?

- Every Institution can have different dates
- Start applying usually Oct 1
- Deadlines each school can be different.

The Nursing deadline is <u>usually</u> earlier than other programs.

 By Nov 1, <u>most</u> schools in Canada and the US are accepting applications.

**Always check each institution for up to date information

How to Apply?

 BC Public Institutions - use the <u>EducationPlanner</u> discover and apply platform.


- Alberta ApplyAlberta
- Ontario <u>OUAC (also separate college app site)</u>
- All others go to the school websites to apply

**Application Centre's will add to the processing time DO NOT wait until the last minute.

To apply you will need...

- 1. Personal Education Number (PEN #)
 - Student Services or Mrs. Turnbull can give this to you, it is also on your report card
- 2. Credit card to pay application fees (VISA DEBIT may not work). These fees are non-refundable.
- 3. Record the application confirmation number and the fee confirmation.

Transcripts



The BC Ministry of Education will allow access to your transcript for the schools you select.

Do this now!

**Some schools will still require you to send hard copy transcripts. Read all communication carefully - do not skim! If you miss something it is on you.

Checklist

- Submit your application and save/print the page with your application ID #.
- Pay the application fee! (Your application will not be fully processed until payment is received).
- By email, you will receive your permanent university or college ID #. This is used to access your status, pay tuition, and choose courses.
 - Do not lose this number
- Check your email often
- Log into your personal account at the university/college using the student number sent to you from that institution.
- This is where you will find your next steps, self-report your grades (if required), apply for scholarships, submit extra supplemental applications, pay tuition, choose classes and correspond with future profs.

BSN NURSING

- Highly competitive at all schools.
- Deadlines to apply <u>can be</u> earlier than other programs at the university.
- Work to attain your highest GPA possible, check <u>all</u> your grade 11 and 12 prerequisites on your chosen schools website.
 - Some schools will require the CASPER suitability test.
- Camosun-UVic admission is currently grades-based only.




