



# GRADUATION PROGRAM

## \*starts in Grade 10\*

To graduate, students will require 80 credits total, with a minimum of 16 at the grade 12 level (including an English 12), and 28 elective course credits.

52 credits are required from the following:

- Two Career Education courses - CLE & CLC (8 credits)
- Physical Health & Education 10 (4 credits)
- Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Language Arts 10, 11 & 12 (12 credits)
- Indigenous Education Focused Course 10, 11 or 12 (4 credits )
- An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits)

*A course is  
typically worth  
4 credits*

# Indigenous-Focussed Course Requirement for Graduation

- Indigenous Education Focused Course 10, 11 or 12 (4 credits )

Options currently at Reynolds - Students require ONE of the FOLLOWING:

- English First Peoples Literary Studies and New Media 10 or 11
- English First Peoples Literary Studies and Spoken Word 10 or 11
- Indigenous Studies (EFP Spoken Word and Explorations Socials 11 Combined) 11/12
- English First Peoples 12

# English

In grades 10 and 11, students are in English 10/11 splits.

Students must take two different English classes over grades 10 and 11

In grade 12, choices are English 12 or English First Peoples 12



- Creative Writing
- Literary Studies
- New Media Studies
- Indigenous Studies 11 - First Peoples Literary Studies and Spoken Word taken with Explorations of Social Studies 11 (8 credits - 4 credits English 11, 4 credits Socials 11)\*
- First Peoples Spoken language and Literary Studies\*
- First Peoples Literary and New Media\*

\* also meets the Indigenous Course Graduation Requirement

# Social Studies

Students in grade 9 and 10 take Social Studies 9 and 10, respectively.

After grade 10, each student must choose at least **one** Socials Studies course to meet the Social Studies 11 or 12 grad requirement (4 credits)

- Explorations of Social Studies 11 (recommended)
- Explorations en Sciences humaines 11 (FRIM)
- Indigenous Studies 11 (mornings, semester 1)
- 20th Century World History 12
- Urban Studies 12
- Philosophy 12
- Social Justice 12
- Law Studies 12


# Other Social Studies Electives

**UVic uStart Program , classes are taken at UVic:**

- Apply in the 2nd semester of your Gr 11 yr. If you are accepted you begin classes in your Gr 12 year.


