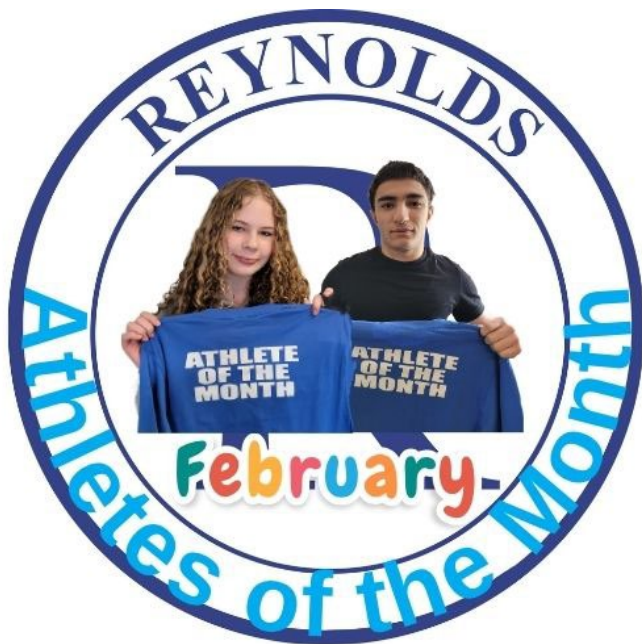

RE: NEIGHBOURHOOD NOTICE OF PESTICIDE APPLICATION FOR LESSER CELANDINE

The District of Saanich is working with residents to control the spread of invasive Lesser Celandine in Saanich. Due to its potential for spread within the municipality, its destructive nature, difficulties in controlling and eradicating it, and its toxicity cutting, the use of pesticide is considered the most effective and appropriate treatment.

As per Saanich Pesticide Bylaw #9054, this letter provides you with notice of pesticide application through selective foliar treatment to an outbreak (or outbreaks) of Lesser Celandine at a property in your neighbourhood (details below). This letter is sent as a courtesy and there is no expectation that you will come into contact with the pesticide. The pesticide will not travel through the soil or air, but will remain contained in the plant material and/or immediate spray area. The application site will have a sign posted at least 48 hours before treatment.
