This can be problematic when communicating with PSI's

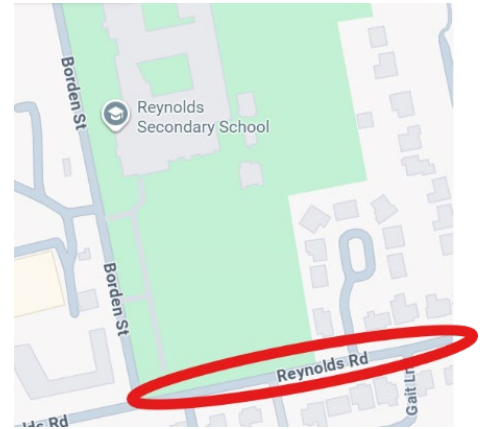
Check your storage and make some space if necessary so nothing gets missed!

It's important to follow the rules that come with your N licence. If you break these restrictions—or receive any other tickets or driving prohibitions—you could face additional graduated licensing penalties.



Zero alcohol or drugs in your blood when you drive.



Display N sign on the back of your vehicle.



No hand-held or hands-free cellphones or other electronic devices.



One passenger only (not including immediate family) unless accompanied by a supervisor age 25+ with a valid Class 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 licence.

**The Greater Victoria School District's Homestay Program is looking for new host families.**

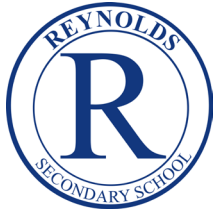
