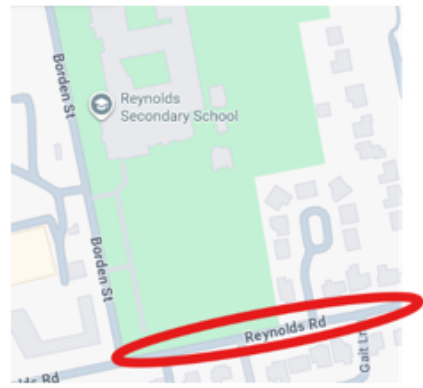

Pick up and drop off:

Our parking lots can be very busy in the mornings and after school and we appreciate everyone's help in keeping students safe. To help with traffic flow and visibility, please do not stop or park in any areas of the parking lot other than **designated parking spaces**. Parking along Reynolds Road is also an option for dropping off and picking up. Cyclists and drivers, please watch for pedestrians and go slowly when entering and exiting lots. Thank you for your help in prioritizing safety!



E-Scooters & E-Bikes

BC Regulations state that riders of e-scooters and e-bikes must be at least 16 years of age. As these modes of transportation have become more popular, we kindly request that students do not bring them to school if they are under 16 years of age. If students are 16 years or older, please ride safely and respectfully. We do not have space inside the building to store e-scooters and e-bikes and if students choose to bring them to school, they will have to be stored/locked in our existing bike racks. Please note, in the past, we have had issues with theft despite best efforts.



What is street legal?

Find out how to ride safely and legally.

On roads with speed limits of 50 km/h or lower:

**Light e-bike (250W)**

- 25 km/h max. speed
- Rider must be 14+ years old

**Standard e-bike (500W)**

- 32 km/h max. speed
- Rider must be 16+ years old



- Must wear a **bicycle helmet** and **ride where a traditional bicycle would ride**.
- Must follow the **rules of the road** like a regular vehicle, per the Motor Vehicle Act.
- Must meet **legal requirements** for public roads in BC, such as **fully operable pedals** that can propel the e-bike and features that **disengage the motor** when the rider stops pedalling or applies the brakes. *For more information, search gov.bc.ca for "E-bike requirements".*
- Driver's licence and insurance are not required.

**Electric kick scooters**

- 25 km/h max. speed
- Rider must be 16+ years old



- Must wear a **bicycle helmet** and **ride where a bicycle would ride**.
- Must follow the **rules of the road**. Central Saanich is part of the Province's Electric Kick Scooter Pilot Project, renewed until April 2028. *For more information, search gov.bc.ca for "Electric kick scooter rules and safety".*
- Driver's licence and insurance are not required.

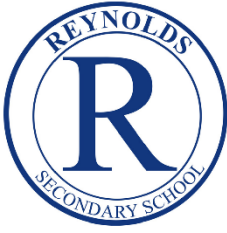
NOT LEGAL on public roads, bike lanes or sidewalks in BC:

- Electric or gas-powered dirt bikes
- Pocket bikes/mini motorcycles
- Electric minibikes
- Electric one-wheels
- Motorized skateboards

These do not meet provincial equipment safety standards for on-road use.
