School Fees:

Included, you will find a sheet that goes over the various fees that occur at the beginning and during the school year. These items can be found and paid for via School Cash Online (there is a link to School Cash on our website). Please reach out to the office with any questions at all about the fees and/or how to pay, etc.

We do recommend purchasing a yearbook at the beginning of the year if your student is interested in one. This is often missed later in the year and students end up disappointed.



Absences/Lates:

Your learning is important! Regular attendance is critical to your success in your courses. Being on time is also important. When students are late, this is both detrimental to their learning, and disruptive to the classroom environment. If you are more than 30 minutes late for a class, come to the office to get a **late slip**. If you have a break from class, use it responsibly.

Welcome to the immediate start of the Fall Sports season! EXECUTIVE: Get involved with Reynolds Secondary PAC!

The Reynolds Secondary Parent Advisory Council (PAC) brings parents together to support our school, stay informed, provide advice to school leadership, and decide how ~\$20,000 in annual grant funding is spent on teams, clubs, and other extracurricular activities. The PAC meets once a month for about an hour, and we urgently need volunteers for PAC Executive roles (Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary at a minimum). All current Executive members have graduating students, and without an Executive, Reynolds' PAC may not be able to receive the grant funding. Elections are held in October, and roles can be filled by acclamation if only one person volunteers.

2026-27 STUDENT FEES, DEPOSITS, ETC.

Student Activity Cost: \$31.50 (Optional)

The Student Activity cost is used to help provide for the extracurricular programs at the school. These activities provide important opportunities for all students to be involved. The activity cost is also used to help offset the expenses associated with student agenda/App, student clubs and other extracurricular activities, school wide activities/assemblies, special events, Fine Arts, and Leadership.

Athletic Fee: \$41.90

One time payment (per year) for any student participating on any school team. This cost subsidizes transportation, athletic association registrations, uniforms, equipment, league play, tournament and championship fees, referees, and other associated costs. This can be paid at the time a student joins a school team.



Textbook Deposit: \$21.05 (Refundable upon request)

A refundable deposit of \$21.05 is requested from all new Reynolds students. This deposit is for educational resource materials (textbooks, reused workbooks, novels, etc) for the duration of a student's enrollment at Reynolds. This deposit will be refunded all or in part, upon request, after return of all educational resource materials. This is at the end of Gr. 12 or if moving schools.



Locker Rental: \$7.45 (Optional)

One-time rental fee of \$7.00 requested from Reynolds students who would like to use a locker. This fee is for the maintenance of lockers and replacement of locks and is generally paid in grade 9 or by anyone new to the school.



GRAD Expenses: \$68.05 (Participating Grade 12s only)

Each year the costs associated with Graduation, primarily the Ceremony at the University of Victoria are recovered from participating students. The funds cover the following expenses:

- Rental of the Farquhar Auditorium at the University of Victoria
- Purchase of graduation gowns, graduate stole, souvenir graduate cap
- Purchase of certificates and folder
- Any other expense associated with the ceremony



This \$68.05 does not cover the cost of the Grad Dinner/Dance. This is a separate optional event, but most graduates participate and celebrate their graduation together at the dinner dance. The price for this ticket varies from year to year but is approximately \$110

School Yearbook: \$68.05 (Optional)

Buy Early in the year so you're not disappointed if you forget when things get busy! The price also generally goes up later in the year.

PAC Staff Appreciation Fund: (Optional)

Optional Costs:

- There will not be any course charges that are imposed simply because a student has elected to take a particular course.
- Under Board Policy, students may only be charged for projects with material costs that enhance the learning opportunities and should have parental permission prior to undertaking these projects. Courses will be structured in such a way that students can meet the expectations for a course without fees, however, some courses may request an enrichment fee. This will be communicated to families as required. **
- Students who elect to use superior materials or work beyond basic projects or activities may be charged for the cost of the extra materials or activity.
- Parents are able to purchase individual student accident insurance if they wish. Details are on our website under the Parent Info tab.

Students are responsible for providing their own basic supplies, such as pens, pencils, paper, binders etc.

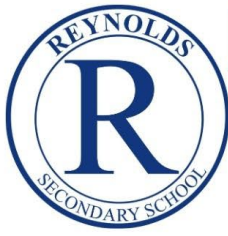
